To have you & your business help Starship Foundation and the Starship National Air Ambulance Service is a life saving gift. Through your donation of unwanted mobile phones, Starship is able to continue to support this medical lifeline for New Zealand families who need emergency care for their children, wherever they are and whenever they need it.

Since the appeal started in February 2009 over \$2.4 million has been donated to The Starship Foundation from the sale of old mobile phones. This money is used to help fund the Starship National Air Ambulance Service.

Each year Starship's National Air Ambulance service rushes top medical experts to over 200 life-threatening emergencies around the country. These specialists stabilise the children and allow them to be brought safely to Starship where they can receive the care they need.

The Mobile phones we receive in working order are refurbished and exported to places such places as Hong Kong, China & Eastern Europe. Those beyond repair are disposed of through the correct environmental channels.
